# Surviving the **Wild West**



Deciding to undertake an aesthetic procedure is a big decision – and choosing a safe practitioner is an even bigger one. With a boom in accessible treatments hitting the market, it can be a stressful challenge making the right decision, particularly with social media being awash with horror stories of patients left disappointed and disfigured. **Hayley Jordan**, clinical director and nurse prescriber at the Aesthetic Skin Clinic, provides a safety checklist to help guide your decision...

## **Check qualifications...**

A one-day course is not enough. Your practitioner should have attended a number of courses and be engaged in a programme of continuous professional development.

## Check time practising...

Everyone has to start somewhere, but it takes a long time to become an expert. If your practitioner is a beginner, ensure they are supported by an experienced mentor.

## Check out-of-hours support...

You need to make sure a full support package is in place 24/7 and there will always be somebody to review you at all times post-procedure.

# Check emergency and complication protocols...

All clinics should be able to prescribe and manage any potential complications in-house. The after-care is just as important as the treatment.

# Check indemnity insurance...

Often never needed, but should be extensive.

**Check membership of recognised professional bodies...** All practitioners should be regulated, accountable and regularly supervised.

### **Check which products will be used...** Ensure they are market leaders with a long and extensive safety profile.

Do your research...

And research again. You can never be too informed.

In my role as director for the International College of Aesthetic Nurses, I am regularly contacted by colleagues who are concerned about industry standards. There is an ongoing government initiative to improve these standards, and work towards a recognised qualification and tighter regulations, but until that time consumers must keep themselves safe.
